Score 5	It's Nearly Perfect!
Standard writing conventions in a Score 5 text are used correctly and in a way that aids the reader's understanding. Any errors tend to be minor; the piece is nearly ready for publication.	<ul> <li>✓ Paragraphing is regular and enhances the organization of the text.</li> <li>✓ Grammar and usage are correct and add clarity to the text as a whole. Sometimes the writer may manipulate conventions in a controlled way—especially grammar and spelling—for stylistic effect.</li> <li>✓ Punctuation is accurate; it enables the reader to move though the text with understanding and ease.</li> <li>✓ The writer's understanding of capitalization rules is evident throughout the text.</li> <li>✓ Most words, even difficult ones, are spelled correctly.</li> <li>✓ The writing is long and complex enough to show the writer using a wide range of convention skills successfully.</li> </ul>
Score 3	Close—I Found a Few Errors
The writer of a Score 3 text exhibits an awareness of a limited set of standard writing conventions and uses them to enhance the texts' readability. Some errors distract and confuse readers. Moderate editing is required before publication.	<ul> <li>✓ Paragraphs are used but may begin in the wrong places, or section that should be separate paragraphs are run together.</li> <li>✓ Conventions may not always be correct; however, problems with grammar and usage are usually not serious enough to distort meaning.</li> <li>✓ End marks are usually correct, but other punctuation marks, such a commas, apostrophes, semi-colons, and parentheses, may be missing or wrong.</li> <li>✓ Common words are usually spelled correctly.</li> <li>✓ Most words are capitalized correctly, but the writer's command of capitalization skills is inconsistent.</li> </ul>
Score 1	Hmm. I'm Distracted By Too Many Errors
In a Score 1 text there are errors in spelling, punctuation, grammar and usage, and paragraphing that seriously impede the reader's comprehension. Extensive editing is required for publication.	<ul> <li>√ Paragraphing is missing, uneven, or too frequent. Most of the paragraphs do not reinforce or support the organizational structure of the text.</li> <li>√ Errors in grammar and usage are very common and distracting; such errors also affect the text's meaning.</li> <li>√ Punctuation, including terminal punctuation, is often missing or incorrect.</li> <li>√ Even common words are frequently misspelled.</li> <li>√ Capitalization is haphazard or reveals the writer's understanding or only the simplest rules.</li> <li>√ The text must be read once just to decode the language and then again to capture the text's meaning.</li> </ul>
